Locel Sergeant Dead; Missing **Since Last Year**

An official telegram was received Thursday by Mr.' and Mrs. Alex Kercsmar, 639 William Street, in-forming them that their son, S/Sgt. William Kercsmar, was killed in action December 11, 1944. S/Sgt. Kercsmar was inducted in-to the service September 13, 1943 and received his basic training at Camp Van Dorn, Miss. Six months later, he was sent abroad and was stationed in England until D-Day when he participated in actua. combat.



S/SGT. WILLIAM KERCSMAR Kercsmar was wounded in the early days of the invasion and re-cuperated in a British Hospital, where he celebrated his 19th birth-day anniversary. On July 26, 1944, he resumed active duty and was then promoted from the rank of sergeant to staff sergeant. The parents received a War De-partment telegram December 29, notifying them that their son was missing in action. In the telegram received Thursday, the War De-partment advised them that the great lapse of time between the two telegrams was due to certain unavoidable circumstances. Memorial services in tribute to S/Sgt. Kercs-mar will be announced later.
