## **Bangor Man Weds British Girl in London**

Word has been received here that Lt. Alfred M. Nittle, son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Nittle, of East Bangor, and Miss Bridget Ann Vernon Bates, daughter of R. A. F. Group Leader and Mrs. Leslie J. Bates, were married on April 12 at the Brompton Oratory, Catholic Church of London, England.

Lt. Nittle is a former Bangor attorney and before entering the service had offices in the Merchants' National Bank Building on Broadway. He is now serving in the United States Army Office Chief of Transportation. Miss Bates was educated in Salisbury, England, and has been engaged in war work in London.

Lt. Nittle was inducted into the service at New Cumberland, in June, 1942, and was later transferred to Camp Lee, Va. He later was sent to the Brooklyn Navy Yard, where he received his rank. He was sent overseas from Camp Shenango.

Miss Bates was attired in a white satin gown and carried cala lillies and wore a veil of hand made Belgium lace which had been in her family for the past nine generations. The couple enjoyed a wedding trip in Angelsey, Beau-Maris and Bangor, Wales. They were attended by Lt. J. C. Smith and Miss Betty Bates, a sister of the bride.
