**Pvt. L. T. Anthony,
Nazareth R. D. 1,
Dies in Africa**

Private LeRoy T. Anthony, 25, died on July 20, in North Africa as a result of an accident one year after he left the United States for overseas duty, according to a message received by his mother, Mrs. Ellen M. Anthony, of Nazareth, R. D. 1. Details of the accident will be sent to the family by letter which will follow the original message.

Private Anthony enlisted in the Army in April of 1937 and for some time was stationed at Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Md., as a member of the Ordnance Department in the capacity of cook. He was sent to England on July 20, 1942, and later took part in the invasion of North Africa.

Born June 18, 1918, he attended the Pennsville School and had been employed on several farms in Northampton County before enlisting. He was a member of Kreidersville Reformed Church.

Besides his mother, Private Anthony is survived by four brothers, George, Slatington, R. D. 1, Richard, Kenneth and Willard, at home, and one sister, Viola, at home.

His father preceded him in death five years ago.
