Pfc. Buchman Killed On **Battlefront**

Word was received today that Pfc. Arthur Buchman, aged 21, former employe of the Globe-Times had been killed in action in France on March 1. The information was contained in a telegram to his father, Earl Buchman, a pressman employed in Philadelphia.

Young Buchman, a graduate of Bethlehem High, entered the service in February, 1943, and after training at Fort Bragg was sent overseas. A brother, Charles, also an employe of the Globe-Times, is also overseas and letters from both indicated that they had met several times in France.
