
Celebrate V-J Day Together

They joined the victory celebra-tion aboard ship August 15, but were reminded by their commanding officer that although the war was over, he cautioned the lookouts to be on the alert for floating mines and other elements of war that do

Burke and Carroda both attended Bethlehem Technical High School and were employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company before they enlisted in the U.S. Navy. They completed their boot training at Sampson, N. Y. and since then, had participated in the battles for Okinawa and Iwo Jima.
