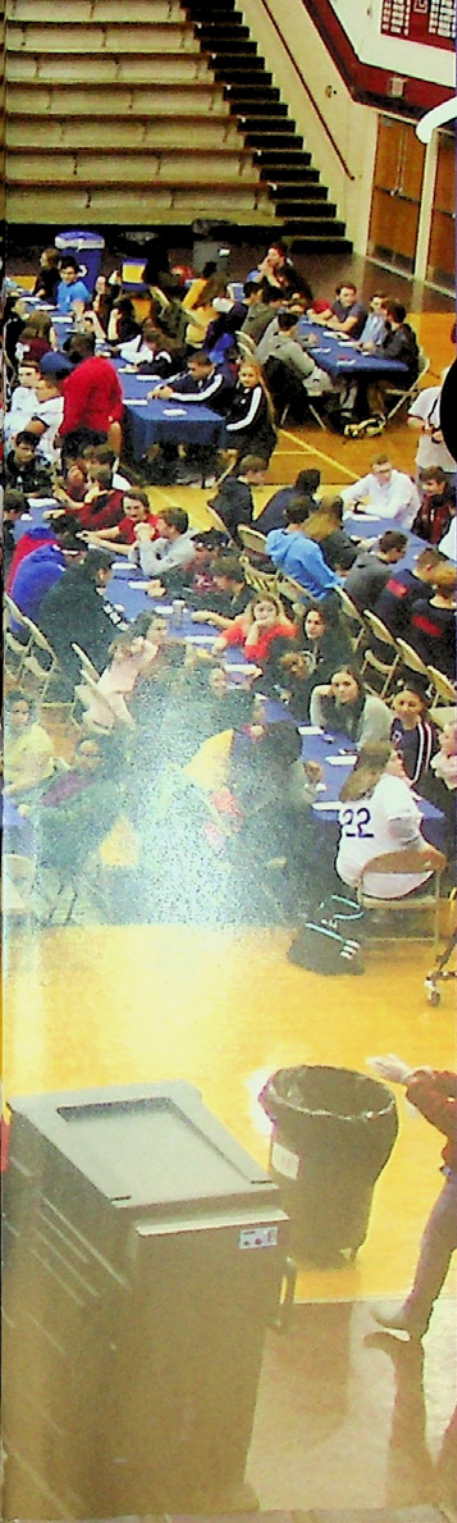


Delicious food Cravings

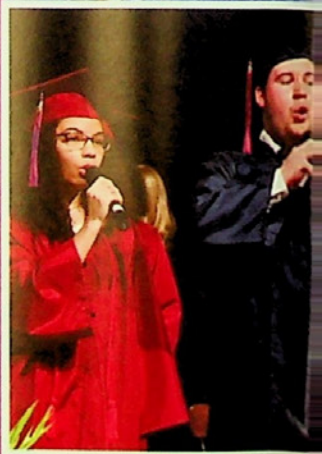
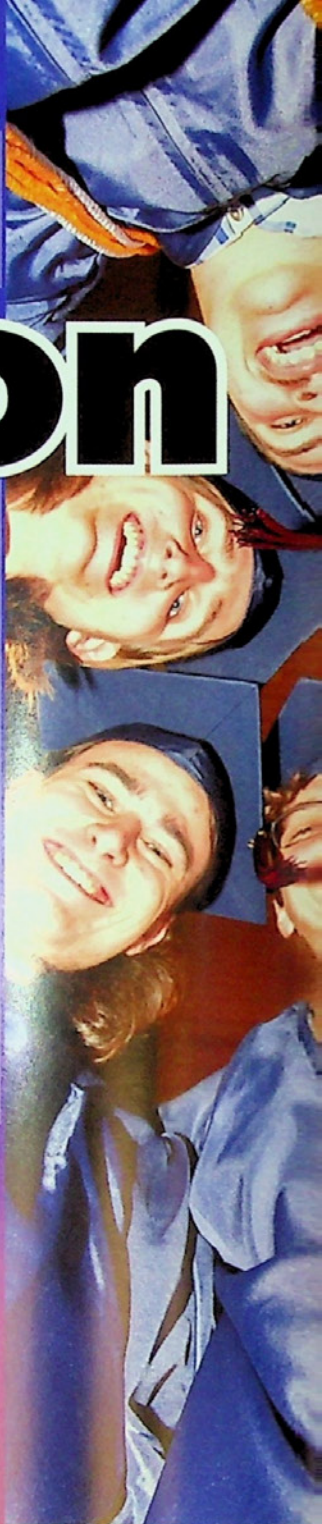
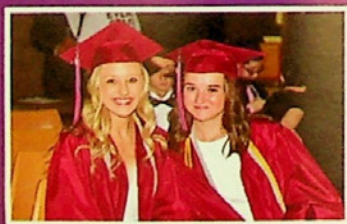
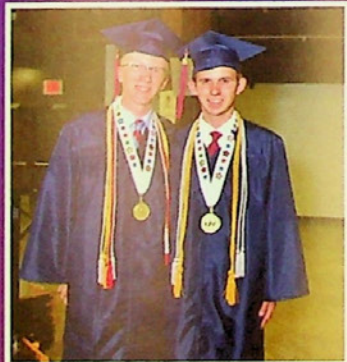


Ceremony of Celebration

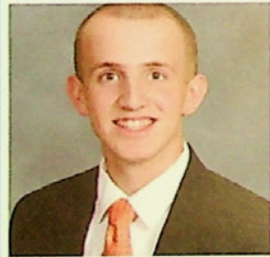

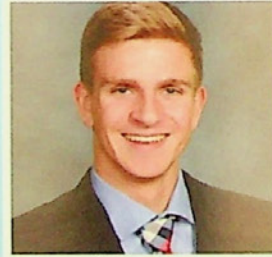

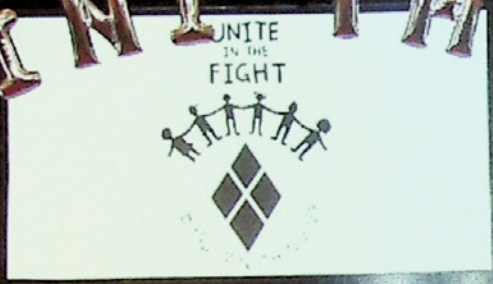
RECYCLING EFFORTS

Most people believe the Bethlehem Area Voteshool (BAVTS) is a waste of time, but BAVTS is actually a great career starter. It has over 20 programs to choose from. In the first year you get to travel to 4 different types of classes and try it. Eventually you get to pick one and then take it for the next 3 years. These courses prepare for the real world in a related career field. You get to experience the real action. Once in 2nd year you have an option to do co-op. Co-op is when you leave your home school to go to BAVTS but once there you leave to go work. Often this co-op work is even paid work during school time. This also gives you an opportunity to go to work right after high school full of skills you already mastered. Many employers come to BAVTS to recruit young talented students/future employees. BAVTS is a great school for anybody interested in any of these programs. With teachers who are willing to help and students who are ready to learn, the opportunities are endless for those who walk these halls, to learn academics and prepare themselves for their future and beyond. The world of science opens up many new ideas, inventions, possibilities, and even problems that need to be faced. Mr. Zham remarked, "we can solve problems, and we have a lot of serious problems. It requires study to recognize science problems exist. Not even realizing a problem exists is an example of 'ignorance'. There is a great feeling of accomplishment when we use scientific thinking to solve a problem. I feel (non-scientifically, of course) that it is our responsibility to use the gifts we have been given to make the world a better place." Science is very important and it is needed to sustain our world and its resources; environmental science is our present and future. "We need this because we need to protect our resources, restore degradation and protect biodiversity. All enhancements of the future sustainability will require chemistry, biology and physics to varying degrees," commented Mr. Schaffer. Students are exposed to many different types of sciences with countless opportunities that will lead to them making a difference in our world. Raj Kundu said science is important because "it teaches us to understand and appreciate the complex world around us. Chemistry teaches us how things are made, physics teaches us how they interact, and biology teaches us how chemistry and physics come together to create living beings. I am very grateful that I have had the opportunity at Liberty to take chemistry, physics, and biology courses because they are each essential to the field of medicine, and I hope to be a doctor in the future."

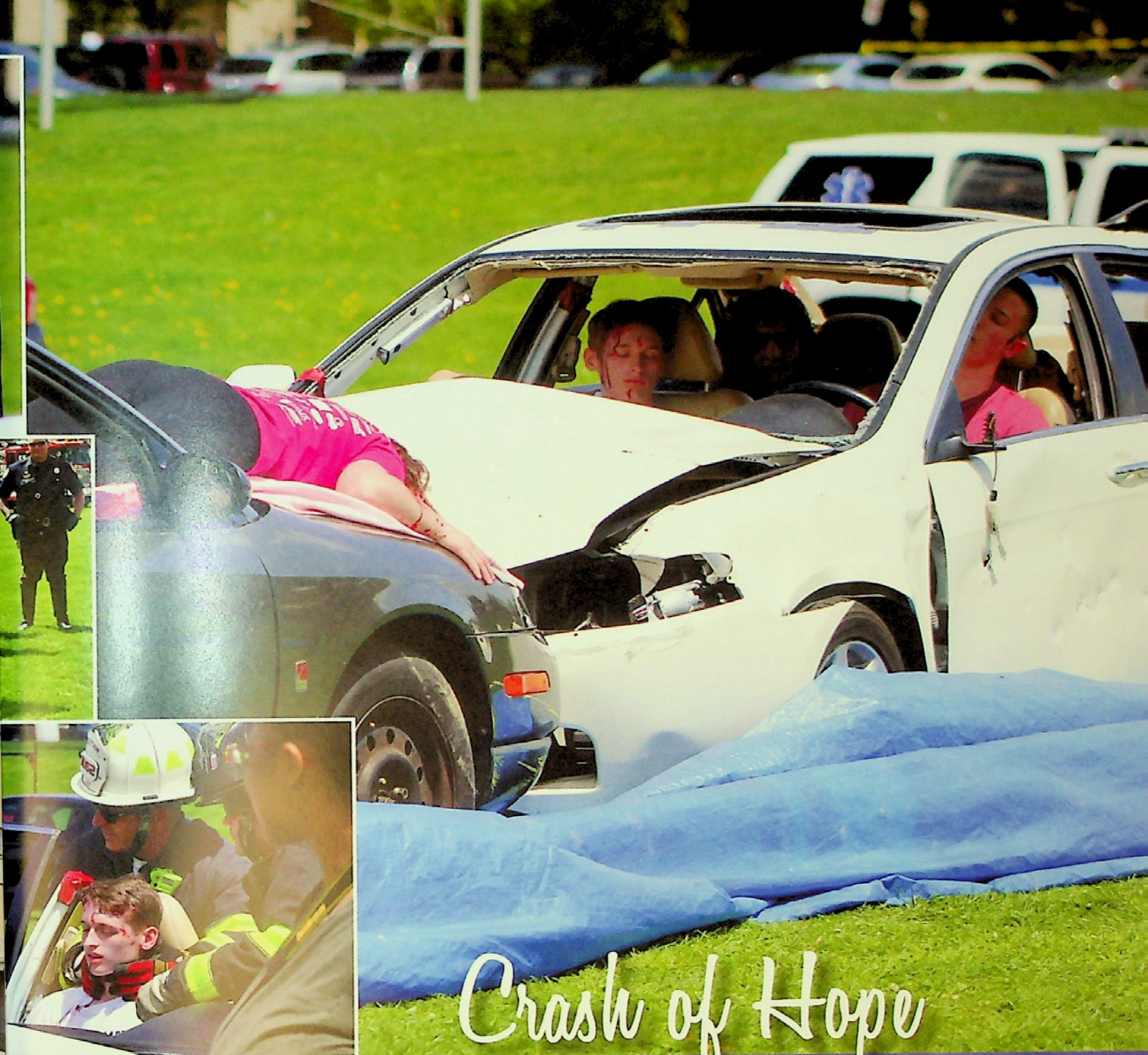

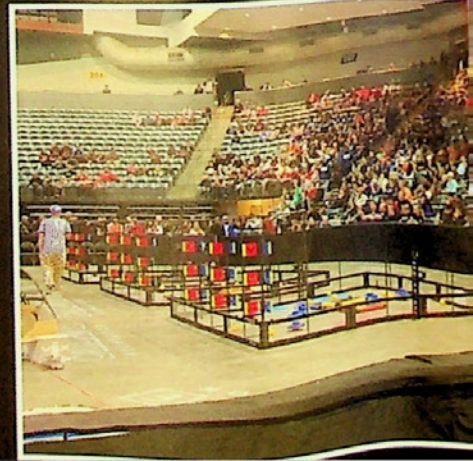
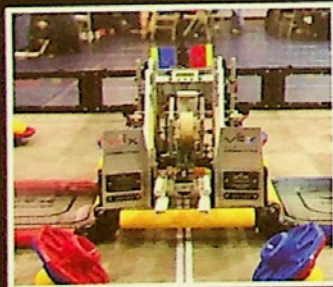
MINDS AT WORK

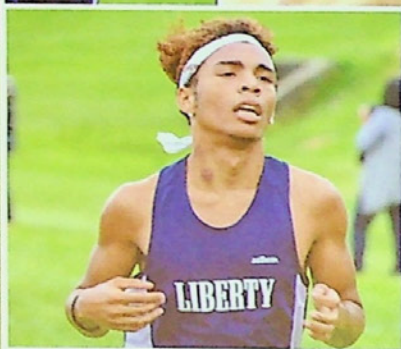

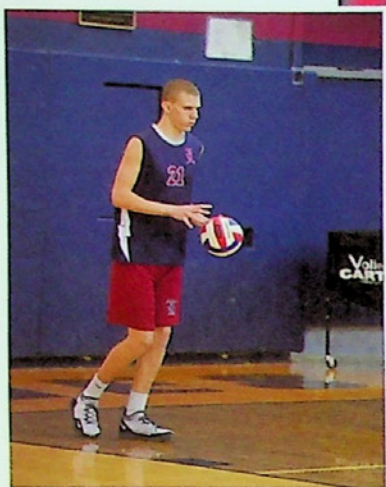

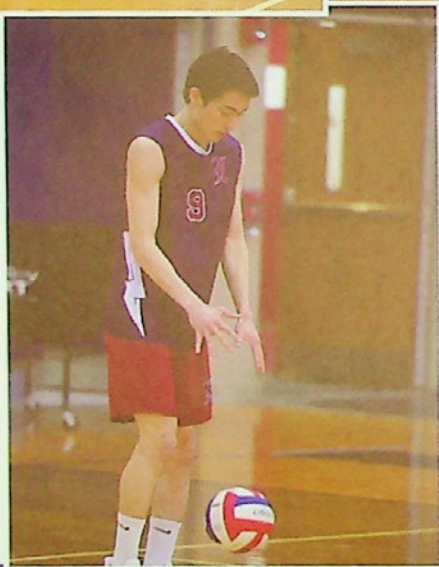

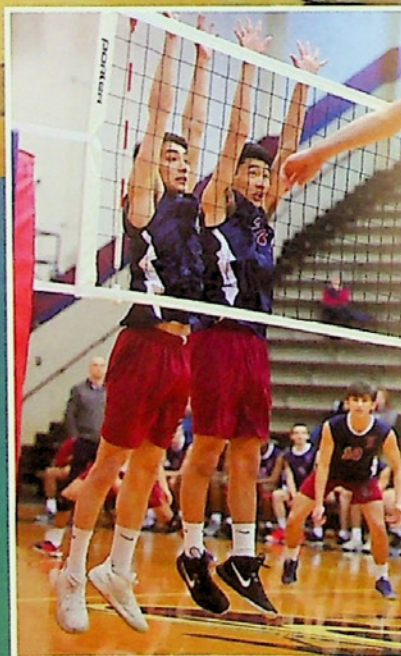

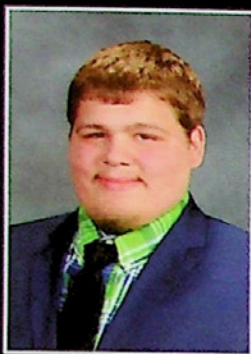
Celebration of GUARD
