Local Nurse Adds Feminine Touch To Bedroom In Germany

pharmacy and made into spreads. The ruffled bedside table is a footlocker in disguise. Both nurses are with the 24th Evacuation Hospital, one of the first units of this size to set up in Germany. The nurses, 40 of them, accustomed to tent living and the plainness of Army cots, gloried in the luxury of private rooms and real beds for the first time since D-Day. Lieut. Henrietta Piccirilli, 339 Wyandotte Street, is also a member of this unit.
