

CURRENT WAR VETERAN Joins Nazareth Legion

Norman G. Grogg, Honorably Discharged from Army, Member of Post.

Norman G. Grogg, 33, of 225 South New Street, Nazareth, has the distinction of being the first World War II veteran of this vicinity to join the Harold V. Knecht American Legion Post 415, through the amendment to the national legion charter which was effected last Summer.

Grogg was honorably discharged from the Army due to a leg injury. He was inducted into the service on June 26, 1941, and was sent to New Cumberland, where he remained for a period of a week and then was sent to Camp Wheeler; Ga. At Camp Wheeler, Grogg did landscape gardening at the head-quarters detachment and also spent several days each week in the office. After three months at Camp Wheeler
