'TEEN AGE DRAFT REGISTRATION TO BEGIN ON FRIDAY

DEC 10 1942

Sixth Enrollment to Take Place
at Office of Respective Selec-
tive Service Boards.

SHOULD HAVE DATA READY

Offices of local selective service boards tomorrow will begin the registration of men who have become eighteen years of age since June 30.

The registration will be conducted only at the offices of the local boards, which in Bethlehem are: No. 1, South Side Municipal Building, East Third Street, second floor; No. 2, Bethlehem Trust Company Building, Broad Street, second floor; No. 3, DPA Building, 713 Eighth Avenue, second floor.

For this sixth registration since October, 1940, youths must report to the local board which has jurisdiction in the vicinity in which they reside. They will be signed up in this order:

December 11 to 17—Those born between July 1, 1924 and August 31, 1924, inclusive.

December 18 to 24—Those born between September 1, 1924 and October 31, 1924, inclusive.

December 26 to 31—Those born between November 1, 1924 and December 31, 1924, inclusive.

There will be no registration on Christmas Day. Those born after January 1, 1925 will register on the day they attain their 18th birthday.

Each youth is urged to report to his draft board prepared to speed up the registration process by having the following information: Full name, place of residence, mailing address, telephone number, age, place of birth, name and address of person who will always know his address, employer's name and address, place of employment or business, race, height and weight.

According to the proclamation by the President, those youths born on or after Jan. 1, 1925 shall register the day they reach their 18th birthday.

Whether draft boards in this area will be compelled to ask for extra volunteer registrars is not known at present. Board officials said they wouldn't call for any unless they expected a big rush.

In the meantime, hints that married men without children would be taken within the next two months came from Harrisburg last night.

Col. B. F. Evans, director of Selective Service in the state, said special efforts are being made to process 18 and 19 years old youths to fill the January quota.

He said where sufficient youths are unavailable, married men without children would be taken.
