**Two Local Youths
Get Bronze Star**

The Bronze Star Medal has been awarded to two local youths who have seen considerable action in the European Theater of Operations. They are: Tech. 5th Grade Raymond K. Yohe, son of Charles Yohe, 211 Spring Street, and S. Sgt. Frank J. Stumer, son of Frank J. Stumer Sr., 1011 Jennings Street.

Tech. Yohe received his award for meritorious achievement in France November 8, 1944, when he and a volunteer litter squad entered an enemy town ahead of the battalion aid station despite constant sniper fire and hand carried a large number of men to safety and medical assistance throughout the night, subject to cold, rain and the danger of enemy fire.

Sergeant Stumer won his award for heroic achievement against the enemy in Germany. No details of the citation accompanying the award were given. A member of the 28th Infantry Division, he was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company before entering the service.
