Four brothers, all serving on ac-tive duty overseas, received promo-tions in rank and citations, recent-

tions in rank and citations, recent-ly. Pfc. Mark F. Ford entered the service in November, 1942, and trained at Fort Eustis, Va. He grad-uated from the Coyne Electrical School in Chicago and was sent for further training to Camp Haan, Calif., and Camp Pickett, Va. Mark, who took part in the invasions of. France, Belgium and Germany, with the First Army, was awarded two commendations by his commanding officers. One of them read in part, "Every one in the United States

should have seen the way you car-ried out your tasks in this tremen-dous undertaking. It will indeed be one of your proudest memories and rightly so, for you assured suc-cess to the war's greatest close sup-port, bombing thus opening the road to the heart of Germany". Patrick Ford, F 1/C; just return-ed from the South Pacific and is spending a 30 day leave at his home. After serving 18 months on a car-rier at sea, Patrick has participated in 42 major battles. He is now awaiting further assignment. Pfc. James Ford, with the Allied Force Institute in Rome, was award-

James entered the service in February 1943 and after landing overseas, took part in the invasions of Sicily, Salerno Naples Cosino and Anzio Salerno, Naples, Casino and Anzio.
