**Bethlehem Soldier
Recovering From
Shrapnel Wound**

THE 318TH STATION HOSPITAL, England—Hit in the left shoulder by mortar shrapnel during an attack against a small road block near Malmedy, Belgium, Pfc. Alexander J. Glass, 23, of 316 Taylor Street, Bethlehem, is recovering at this United States Army station hospital in England.

His ward surgeon, Captain Heinz E. Cron, of St. Louis, Mo., said, "Pfc. Glass is making a splendid recovery. His general physical condition is excellent."

Halted in their advance towards Malmedy by a stubborn German position, Pfc. Glass' infantry unit attacked in force.

"We were moving along steadily and I was kept busy firing my rifle when a piece of shrapnel hit me," he said.

Pfc. Glass worked at the Bethlehem Steel Mills before entering the Army in January, 1944. He is the son of Mrs. Mary Glass of Easton.
