Sergeant Curtis E. Bender, section
leader with the 327th Glider Infantry Regiment of 101st Airborne Division, son of Mrs. Mary Bender, 1523
Linden Street, Bethlehem, has been
awarded the Bronze Star Medal for
meritorious service in action near
Bastogne, Belgium, last Christmas.
"During the historic battle of the
"Bulge", Bender exposed himself to
the fire of the enemy on many occasions to encourage the men of his
mortar platoon to carry on the fight
in spite of overwhelming odds," the
citation said.

Sgt. Bender was inducted in November 1942 and trained at Camp
Wheeler, Ga., before reporting to
the 101st Airborne at Fort Bragg, N.
C., in March 1943. He shipped overseas to England in September 1943.
The sergeant saw action in the
airborne invasion of Normandy and

Holland; siege of Bastogne, the defensive fighting in Alsace Lorraine, and the final mop-up battles in southern Germany.
