Ensign Callen Takes Bride at Chapel Rites

Mr. Jones gave his daughter in marriage. She wore a gown of white satin ending in a train trimmed with rose point heirloom lace and a finger tip veil falling from a coronet of the same lace and carried a bridal bouquet of white orchids and white gardenias.

Miss Mona Louise Jones, sister of the bride, the bridesmaid, wore a gown of periwinkle blue faille with a tiara of coral carnations in her hair and carried a bouquet of coral carnations.
