Henry R. Hartman, recently promoted to Sergeant in the U. S. Marine Corps, is a veteran of the bloody battles fought on the Mariana's, Eniwetok, Perry Island, Carolinas, Luzon, Leyte, Lingayan Gulf, Marshall Islands, Babelthaupt and Samar. Hartman, who should know, says the "Jap mosquitos differ only in size, however, both are suffering the same fate."

The young marine is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry J. Hartman, 736 Broadway. His father had seen action during the First World War with the famed Third Division. Sgt. Hartman enlisted in the Corps, May 10, 1943, and was sent to Parris Island for boot training. He transferred to Cherry Point, N. C., and from there to San Diego, Calif., Boca Chico, Fla., Naval School at Jacksonville, Fla., and Norman, Okla. He is a Liberty High School graduate and a former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company. Sergeant Hartman is stationed with a Marine Bomber Squadron "somewhere in the Philippines" at present.
