We must honor the lives of Black people stolen from us by law enforcement. names and continue to hold our government, elected officials, allies, and adv accountable to these murders and attempted murders until there is national policies passed that uplift Black folks and invest in our communities, so that to breathe freely.

Gadfly sees honor the dead, hold those responsible accountable, press for legislation.

Look at the July 18 press release on the deaths of John Lewis and and Rev. C.T. Vivian.

These courageous human beings, now among our greatest ancestors, disrupted the status quo — commerce/business-as-usual — FOR YEARS before anyone took notice. They were attacked, despised, and criticized relentlessly by mainstream society and their own people, but they persisted. Only in their latter years did they receive the honor due to them, including being awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom. Perseverance, tenacity, and determination (among other things) in this struggle link us to them. None of us are free until all of us are free, so we commit daily to the work of making Black Lives Matter in policy and practice knowing our struggle for justice is a part of the same continuum of human rights struggle led by those before us.

What Defunding the Police Really Means

"Defund." Poor choice of word, but I guess we're stuck with it. Gadfly has written several times earlier that defunding the police may not be your cup o'tea, but it is not a hare-brained idea. And he has surveyed several model programs for you. Why defund? The video says because we tried reforms of the system and we've tried new ways of training, and the problem has not gone away. Reasonable. It's a solution to a problem they see. Some, perhaps many, don't see a problem that needs to be solved and hence do not understand defunding.

Look at **What We Believe**, the BLM creed.

Begins with "We acknowledge, respect, and celebrate differences and commonalities."

Ends with "We embody and practice justice, liberation, and peace in our engagements with one another."

In between find such tenets as

We are guided by the fact that all Black lives matter, regardless of actual or perceived sexual identity, gender identity, gender expression, economic status, ability, disability, religious beliefs or disbeliefs, immigration status, or location.

We make space for transgender brothers and sisters to participate and lead.

We are self-reflexive and do the work required to dismantle cisgender privilege and uplift Black trans folk, especially Black trans women who continue to be disproportionately impacted by trans-antagonistic violence.

We build a space that affirms Black women and is free from sexism, misogyny, and environments in which men are centered.

We practice empathy. We engage comrades with the intent to learn about and connect with their contexts.

We make our spaces family-friendly and enable parents to fully participate with their children. We dismantle the patriarchal practice that requires mothers to work "double shifts" so that they can mother in private even as they participate in public justice work.

BLM believes in changing racial and sexual roles. Join the club, Gadfly might say.

Of the 15 tenets, the one that critics consistently point to as an indication of BLM's revolutionary Marxism is

We disrupt the Western-prescribed nuclear family structure requirement by supporting each other as extended families and "villages" that collectively care for one another, especially our children, to the degree that mothers, parents, and children are comfortable.
