### Receives Letter From General Telling of Hero Son's Exploits

Mrs. Afia Kissel, R. D. 3, Bath, received a letter from Gen. George C. Kenney, USA, telling of her son, Sgt. Samuel Kissel's "outstanding devotion to duty and his exceptional skill" for which he was personally commended by the general.

The letter read in part: "I feel sure that you will share my pride in the excellent record he has established as a member of an Air Force team during more than two years of sustained operations in the Pacific and Far East. Your son typifies the many specialists who are a vital part of our organization. Without the crew chiefs, the bomb loaders, the engineers, the mess sergeants and the clerks, it would be impossible for our combat crews to carry the war to the enemy. Sgt. Kissel has been clerk-typist for one of our air service groups. The consistently high quality of his work has won the respect of his officers and fellow soldiers."
