Sgt. Bachman Takes Bride At Pro-Cathedral

The bride, gowned in white brocaded taffeta with finger-tip veil and beaded Juliet cap, and carrying a white prayer book with rose-bud streamers, was escorted by her father, who gave her in marriage. Miss Ileen Whitehead; her bridesmaid, wore pale green brocaded taffeta and carried a bouquet of old-fashioned pink roses.

Pfc. Robert B. Hazzard, USMC, Cherry Point, N. C., brother of the bride, was best man. Melvin Bachman, brother of the bridegroom, and Alton Morris were ushers.

Mrs. Frederick Pearson, organist, a cousin of Mrs. Hazzard, played the traditional wedding marches.

The bride is a graduate of Liberty High School and attended Bethlehem Business College. For the past two years, she has been in the Marine Corps, stationed at Cherry Point.
