**"KEEP STEEL ROLLING,"
YANK WRITES FRIENDS**

**Local Soldier Says English Treat
Americans Kindly.**

"Keep the steel rolling, and don't stop. We need it."

That's what Private Michael J. Kish, located "somewhere in England" told John Gregorich, of 1619 Columbia Street, in a letter dated August 16, and received locally today.

"The people over here treat us nicely. We have blackouts nightly, have long hikes and the food is satisfying.

"The training over here is different, but all of the boys are rugged. Everything is O. K. but the cigarettes, they are not like those we got back home", he said.

He may not know it, but his friend Gregorich has planned to send him a generous supply of American made "fags".

Kish left Bethlehem in January of this year, and got his preliminary training at army camps in Georgia and Florida.
