Dies of Wounds

Domenick Falcone Roseto, Dies As Result of Wounds

Word was received by Mr. and Mrs. Phillip Falcone of Jefferson Street, Roseto, Saturday afternoon, that their son, Pvt. Domenic Falcone, of the United States Army, who had been reported previously as wounded in action in Luxembourg on Dec. 25, 1944, died on the same day as a result of those wounds.

Pvt. Falcone, who was 31 years of age, was inducted into the armed forces in April, 1942, and received training at Fort Riley, Kan., Fort Jay, N. Y.; Fort Meade, Md., and Camp Pickett, Va. He was sent overseas in December, 1943. While in this country he was assigned to the military police, but upon arrival overseas transferred to the infantry.

Besides his parents he is survived

by a brother, Fred, of Bethlehem; another brother, Pfc. Phillip Falcone, of the United States Army in Europe; three sisters, the Misses Mary and Mamie, at home, and Mrs. Louis Angeline, of Bangor, and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Mary Sabatino, of Roseto. Prior to his induction Le was employed at the Perfect Garment Company in Bangor.
