Pen Argyl Soldier Now Reported To Be War Prisoner

Mr. and Mrs. William W. Jones of 100 North Lobb Avenue, Pen Argyl, yesterday received a card from their son, Pvt. Hugh P. Jones, 26, revealing that he is a prisoner of the Germans.

Pvt. Jones was reported in a telegram received from the U. S. War Department, on January 18, as "missing in action in Luxembourg since December 19."

On the card which Pvt. Jones sent to his parents, dated January 24, he states that he is in good health. At the time that Pvt. Jones was reported missing, the last letter received by Mr. and Mrs. Jones was dated December 10.

He was inducted into the army on March 26, 1942. He received basic training at Camp Cooke, California; also Pine Camp, N. Y. He went overseas in January of 1943 and was attached to a Tank Battalion.

Prior to entering the Army service, Pvt. Jones was a graduate of the Pen Argyl High school, class of 1937, where he was a member of the varsity football team. He was also employed by the Julius Kayser Company, Bangor. He is a member of the Zion Methodist church, Pen Argyl.
