## Lieut. Joseph Keating Wounded In Battle on Belgian Front 10 1945

Yesterday, sorrow was again visited on the family of Mr. and Mrs.. Miles Keating, Sr., of 701 Wyandotte Street. A telegram from the War Department announced that their son, First Lieutenant Joseph F. Keating, 26, was seriously wounded in Belgium on January 23. Last Sunday, another son, Miles Keating, Jr., died in St. Luke's Hospital. On the same day a brother of Mrs. Keating, Charles Free, died in Nazareth.

The young officer, whose serious condition was just announced, was a graduate of Bethlehem Catholic High School in 1937. In 1941, he graduated from the school of business administration at Lehigh University. He entered the Army in April of 1942, leaving for overseas duty last October. A sister, Second Lieutenant Marie A. Keating, is with the Army Nurse Corps at, Fort Bragg, N. C.
