The citation accompanying the DFC read in part: "For extraordinary achievement while participating in operational flights totaling more than 300 hours in unarmed, heavilyloaded transport airplanes, during which exposures to enemy fire was

probable and expected."
Accompanying the Air Medal was the following citation: "For meritorthe following citation: "For meritorious achievement as pilot from 19 June 1945 to 7 August 1945, while participating in operational flights totaling more than one hundred fifty hours. During the periods indicated, he completed flights over the mountainous terrain of China carrying troops, engineering equipment ammunition and other supment, ammunition and other supplies to the front lines."

Prior to entering the service, Lt. Genther was a student in journalism at Michigan State College.
