Lieut. Miller Is Killed in Plane Crash

Bernard Russell Miller, 23, of 222 Seventh Avenue, was killed Saturday afternoon in an airplane crash near Fort Worth, Texas, according to information received by his parents from the War Department. No details of the accident were given.

Miller, a second lieutenant in the U. S. Army Air Corps, was a native of Bethlehem. He was a son of

Gustave and Carrie Reinbold Miller and was a member of St. Peter's Lutheran Church.

He attended the local public schools and was graduated in 1940 from Bethlehem Technical High School. He entered the employ of the Bethlehem Steel Company as draftsman and remained there until November 11, 1942, when he entered the army.

He had pre-flight training at Nashville, Tenn.; Maxwell Field, Ala.; Bennettsville, S. C.; Shaw Field, Fort Sumter, S. C., and Spence Field, Ga., where he was graduated as a pilot on September 30, 1943.

He was pilot at Fort Worth, Texas, working at the Consolidated Vultee Aircraft Corp., as assistant air force representative, when he met death.

Survivors are the parents, maternal grandmother, Mrs. Isabella Reinbold, Moorestown; six brothers, Seaman First Class Edward T. Miller, U. S. Navy, somewhere at sea; Seaman Second Class Rodney G. Miller, U. S. Navy, Chicago, Ill.; James H., Charles A., George W. and Robert A. at home; three sisters, Marian A., Alberta M. and Jane A., at home.
