**MARINE CORPS HERO
IN LOCAL STEEL PATROL**

**Bernard Rosenberg Huft in Carolina
Blast, Takes Job Here.**

Bernard Rosenberg, 29, a former Marine, who has been prevented from continuing to serve in the Navy following the recovery from severe injuries received in saving fellow passengers from a burning automobile in North Carolina last March, is again in uniform but not in one of the Marines. Earlier in the week he became a member of the Bethlehem Steel Company's police force.

Rosenberg last March had a narrow escape from death, when he entered five times the blazing automobile in rescuing his fellow passengers near Smithfield, N. C., after the car had been struck by a truck bearing 30,000 pounds of explosives.

He suffered severe burns of the legs and eyes in making the rescue. After his discharge from the hospital, the rigid examination rules of the Navy precluded him from continuing as a Marine.

He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Rosenberg, 838 Delaware Avenue.
