Wedding In Britain: Nazareth Soldier and Bride

Old English Church Scene of Nazareth Soldier's Wedding

An old church in Sheffield, England, with the old burying ground adjacent to the church, was the scene of the wedding of an English girl and an American soldier on February 22.

The young soldier is Pvt. Don L. Detweiler, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Don L. Detweiler, of 59 East High Street, Nazareth, and the attractive bride Miss Audrey E. Robinson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. S. Cyril Robinson, of 46 Trap Lane, Bents Green, Sheffield.

Ecclesall Church was the setting for the wedding during a 24-day leave of the bridegroom, which was spent in England after months of fighting on the continent.

The bride is employed as a private secretary by a British manufacturing corporation. The bridegroom, a graduate of Nazareth High School with the class of 1940, was formerly in the employ of the Lone Star Cement Corporation in Nazareth. He has been in the Army 28 months, 21 of which have been spent overseas. He was in action in France, Belgium, Luxembourg and Germany.
