## Captain Klotz Wounded in Belgium Action

JAN 19 1945

Another Bethlehem boy has been seriously wounded in action in Belgium, according to a War Department telegram received last evening.

Captain Richard D. Klotz is hospitalized somewhere overseas as a result of wounds suffered Dec. 22 in Belgium. His wife, the former Anna Borlodan, was notified late last evening. No other details were included in the wire, but it was stated that further reports of the condition of the young man would be sent at intervals.

This morning, Mrs. Klotz, who resides with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Borlodan, at 32 East Union Boulevard, received a letter from

her husband dated Dec. 15, stating that he was in the best of health and spirits, having just read ten letters from her that reached him all in one batch.

The young officer who is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Klotz, 608 Ontario Street, entered Army service Jan. 3, 1941. On Sept. 3, 1944, he celebrated his 27th birthday in England just prior to his departure for France. A former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company, he has two brothers in service: Corporal William Klotz, in New Guinea, and Corporal James, somewhere in Europe.
