AN EIGHTH AIR FORCE BOMBER STATION, England—As an airplane mechanic on a B-17 Flying Fortress, Pfc. Stanley Van Gorden, 24, son of Mr. and Mrs. Norman Van Gorden, Upper Broadway, Wind Gap, Pa., is responsible for keeping the heavy bombers in A-1 condition for the many bombing assaults made on Nazi communication and supply lines located near the battle line in Germany.
