Claire M. Brown, Red Cross Worker, Assigned to Luzon

Local Red Cross worker, Claire M. Brown, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. M. Brown, 427 Main St., was recently assigned to the Capitol Building in an area on Luzon, under the Provincial Government of Batangas, about 75 miles from Manila. The undamaged portion of the building is used by the Red Cross personnel, but is still quite battle scarred.

Working in Military Welfare Service, Miss Brown interviews worried G. I.'s and takes the necessary steps to alleviate their anxieties. She was one of a group of 200 girls, selected from all over the country to relieve war-weary Red Cross workers, as fresh soldiers relieve high-point G. I.'s.

Miss Brown graduated from Bethlehem High School and Bethlehem Business College. Before enlisting in the Red Cross service, she held a government position with the War Production Board in Allentown for two years.
