Now Reported Held By Nazi's **In Prison Camp**

Pfc. P. Joseph Conahan, son of Dr. and Mrs. F. J. Conahan, of 114 West Fourth Street, reported miss-ing in action since September 29, is a German prisoner. Information relating to the young soldier's whereabouts was embodied

in a letter dated November 22, received from him today by his par-ents. He is confined to Stalag 2-B, Germany: According to his letter, he is in good health but says the

he is in good health but says the food is bad. He is a graduate of Liberty High School, class of '41, was an out-standing drummer, and was a member of the school band and orchestra. He was a member of a contingent from Valley Forge Mil-itary Academy that entered the armed forces 'on February 20, 1942. He received his preliminary train-ing at Camp Meade, Md., and was subsequently transferred to Camp Wheeler, Ga., thence to Africa and Italy. He participated in the inva-sion of Southern France, and was with General Patch's Seventh Army

with General Patch's Seventh Army in the Belfort sector when taken prisoner.

February 3, 1945
