Now Reported Held By Nazi's In Prison Camp

Pfc. P. Joseph Conahan, son of Dr. and Mrs. F. J. Conahan, of 114 West Fourth Street, reported missing in action since September 29, is a German prisoner.

Information relating to the young soldier's whereabouts was embodied in a letter dated November 22, received from him today by his parents. He is confined to Stalag 2-B, Germany. According to his letter, he is in good health but says the food is bad.

He is a graduate of Liberty High School, class of '41, was an outstanding drummer, and was a member of the school band and orchestra. He was a member of a contingent from Valley Forge Military Academy that entered the armed forces on February 20, 1942.

He received his preliminary training at Camp Meade, Md., and was subsequently transferred to Camp Wheeler, Ga., thence to Africa and Italy. He participated in the invasion of Southern France, and was with General Patch's Seventh Army in the Belfort sector when taken prisoner.

February 3, 1945
