**Memorial Services
Sunday Night For
Bath Navy Man** 18 1945

Memorial services will be held on Sunday evening at 7 p. m. in St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Bath, for the late Amos J. Demko, deacon and member of the church council, who was drowned as a result of enemy action in the South Pacific November 20, just nine months after he had been inducted.

Demko who was 35 and father of four children, was ship serviceman's barber, third class, a rating attained only 19 days before his death.

A letter which Mrs. Demko received from Captain Phillip G. Beck, stated that his body was recovered and was buried with a service on an island in the Azores.

Demko was inducted February 12, 1944, and received his training at Sampson, N. Y. He was stationed at Newport, R. I., for five weeks and later left for duty from a camp in Virginia.

He is survived by his wife, Helen, nee Fehnel, and four children, Gerald, Reynold, Harriet and Naomi, all at home, a brother, three sisters, a step-sister and a step-brother.
