Crews of the 40's have been com-mended repeatedly by the ship's captain, not only for their marks-manship, but also for their alert-ness in spotting enemy aircraft and opening fire on them. Kilpatrick's job is seeing that the gun is correctly elevated. Okinawa is his seventh major Pacific opera-tion since coming aboard when she was commissioned two years ago. Before entering the Navy in Feb-ruary, 1943, he was employed at the R. K. Laros Silk Mill. which have been credited with dead-
