**On 40-Day Leave**

Seaman George Dunbar, who received a bullet wound in the right shoulder while in action with the U. S. Marines at Guadalcanal in October last, returned to town on a forty-day leave to visit his stepfather, George Miller, 1121 Sioux Street, and other relatives.

After being a casualty in the war, he was taken to California where he recuperated in a hospital and from which place he left on his return home. He is in good condition again.

Seaman Dunbar surprised his aunt, Mrs. Harry E. Brittenburg, of Seneca Street at 5 p. m. Tuesday when he "walked in on her." She had no previous knowledge of his coming.

He enlisted last November a year ago. He speaks very highly of the courage and bravery of the U. S. Marines and what they will do to the Japs in the future.
