Rank Boosted



S/Sgt. Ellwood W. Miller was recently promoted, according to word received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Miller, 15 West Locust Street. S/Sgt. Miller enlisted in the armed forces in June, 1942. He left New York in September, 1944, for overseas duty and landed at Scotland and then to Southampton, England, from where he embarked for France and landed on the famous Omaha Beach. He was assigned to the Public Relations Department of Supreme Headquarters in Paris. After six months he was assigned to the 9th Army and was at Muenster, Germany on V-E Day.

After hostilities ceased Sgt. Miller was assigned to the G-5 Section of 9th Army Headquarters and later to the same section of the 7th Army. After setting up this section he was again transferred to Karlsruhe, Germany and assigned to the legal department where he assisted in setting up the civilian courts under the command of Major Brenen. Four weeks ago he was transferred to the Administrative Department at Stuttgart and assigned to the position of chief clerk for that department.

S/Sgt. Miller wears the European Theatre of Operations ribbon along with two bronze stars for major engagements along with the Good Conduct ribbon and also a 3-year service stripe. Previous to his entrance into the armed forces he was employed in the office of the Bethlehem Foundry & Machine Company.
