

Pfc. E. E. Korn Dies in Action In Germany

Another local soldier. Pfc. ^{Elias} Edward Korn, son of Mr. and Mrs. Emmanuel Korn, 222 Crest Avenue, has made the supreme sacrifice while fighting with First Army infantry, deep in Germany. A telegram received by his parents yesterday stated that Pfc. Korn was killed in action March 26.

The young infantryman has been overseas since September. He was inducted in December, 1942, while employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company, and sent to Fort Myers, Va.; Fort Bragg, N. C., and Fort

Meade, Md., to complete his training. His brother, Sgt. Emmanuel Korn, is fighting with the Third Army in Germany. At one point during the battle for Germany, the two brothers were only 50 miles apart and tried desperately to see each other, but to no avail.

Pfc. Korn attended Washington and Broughal Junior High Schools. Memorial services will be announced later.

In addition to his parents and brothers, he is survived by three sisters, Pearl and Eve, at home, and Mrs. Anthony Ferrara, this city.
