Capt. J. A. Manley Named C. O. of 43rd Infantry Division

WITH THE 43RD INFANTRY (WINGED VICTORY) DIVISION ON LUZON.—Captain John A. Manley, husband of Mrs. Ruth Manley, 1105 Delaware Avenue, Wilmington, Del., has been named commanding officer of headquarters company of the 43rd Infantry (Winged Victory) Division during combat operations on Luzon. He is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew T. Manley, of 72 West Broad Street, Bethlehem, Pa.

Captain Manley, who was commissioned a reserve second lieutenant in 1938, first came overseas in July, 1943, and was stationed in Hawaii. He returned to the States in November of that year to attend the Officers' Advanced Course at Fort Benning, Ga. Returning to the Southwest Pacific in March, 1944, he saw action at Morotai and Biak.

Prior to entering the service, he was employed as a chemist at the E. I. duPont de Nemours & Company, Wilmington.
