**Pfc. Raymond Brauchle
Flown Home After
Service in Europe**

Pfc. Raymond L. Brauchle, son of Charles J. and the late Gertrude E. Brauchle, 39 East Garrison Street, is home on a 45-day furlough after serving in the European Theater of Operations. The young infantryman was flown home by the Air Transport Command.

Pfc. Brauchle wears the ETO ribbon with three battle stars, Combat Infantryman's Badge, Good Conduct Medal and Presidential Unit Citation. He served with the Ninth Infantry, Second Division of the First Army in France and Germany, participating in the Battle of the Bulge and campaigns in Bastogne and Boulogne. SEP 25 1945

Entering the service January 18, 1944, he was sent overseas in July, 1944, after training at Camp Blanding, Fla. Before entering the service he was employed with his father in the cabinet-making and trucking business. He attended local schools.
