ABLE TO WALK AGAIN

Via V-Mail to his mother, Mrs. Letitia Bailey, Columbia st., comes the following letter from Sgt. William Bailey, now somewhere in Australia with the U. S. Army:

Dear Mother: Just a few lines to let you hear from me. I am now out of the hospital and feeling fine. I am able to walk again, which makes everything just swell. However, for a while I thought I might never walk again. I have recived the best of treatment from the hospital.

I am now in Australia. However, I don't know how long I will be here . . . I saw some of the boys I used to go to school in Shippensburg with. Two were in the hospital with broken legs. Sgt. Bailey was wounded in action in New Gulnea and got his field hospital treatment under American Red Cross direction.
