Col. Bewley Ends Service, Back at Lehigh

Loyal V. Bewley has resumed his duties as Professor and Head of the Department of Electrical Engineering at Lehigh University, E. Kenneth Smiley, University vice-president announced today.

Prof. Bewley has been on leave of absence from Lehigh since June, 1942 when he entered active duty with the army. He held the rank of lieutenant colonel and in December, 1943 was awarded the silver star for gallantry in action at the German border. During his service in the ETO he also fought under General George Patton in France, a territory familiar to him as he spent 19 months there during World War I.

A graduate of the University of Washington where he received his B. S. degree in Electrical Engineering, Prof. Bewley came to Lehigh in 1940 after 17 years with General Electric in Schenectady. He took his M.S. at Union University.

Author of the book, "Traveling Waves on Transmission Systems," he has also written many technical papers.

Another veteran added to the Lehigh University staff is James D. Mack, also of Bethlehem, who has been named assistant to Howard S. Leach, University librarian. Mr. Mack, who served with the United States Navy for over three years, held the rank of lieutenant.

Mr. Mack was graduated from Lehigh University in 1938 and before entering the service in May, 1942, was employed by The Bethlehem Steel Co. Stationed in the Pacific theater for 15 months, he participated in the engagements of Okinawa, Iwo Jima, the first raid on Tokyo and the occupation of Japan.
