Local Navy Man Takes Bride in Britain

Mrs. Julia Krajczar, of 326 North New Street, has received word of the marriage of her son, John Frank Krajczar, B. M. 2-c, USN, and Miss Eileen Lofts, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Lofts, of 6 Clifton Villas, Falmouth, England.

The wedding was held in St. Mary's Catholic Church, Falmouth, on May 19 with Navy Chaplain P. Lynch officiating.

Miss Erigene Lofts was her sister's maid of honor and Miss Pamela Martin was bridesmaid. The bride wore a long white dress with fingertip veil and her attendants, lime green gowns with headdresses of fuschia net.

Joseph Hunt, of Indianapolis, Ind., and Richard Smythe, of Toledo, Ohio, both in the U. S. Navy, served as best man and usher for the bridegroom.

The couple spent their honeymoon at St. Ives while the bridegroom was on a five-day leave.

The bride attended the Roman Catholic School of St. Mary's and was awarded a scholarship to Falmouth High School for Girls. She is employed by Lloyd's Bank of England. The bridegroom attended Bethlehem High School and was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Company at the time of his enlistment, Dec. 4, 1943.
