Pvt. Bertram Bealer Inducted Last June-Engagement Announced Before Departure.

Inducted June 12, 1942, at Wilkes-Barre, the young soldier had been employed before induction as a crane operator in No. 1 Open Hearth department of the Bethlehem Steel Company plant, of which his stepfather, Mr. Schleicher, is a foreman. A brother, Warren, 18, has passed his first examination and expects to be called for duty soon.

Just before he left for service his engagement to Miss Marion Longenour, daughter of Mr and Mrs. Roland Longenour, 308 Arch Street, this city, was revealed but the wedding was postponed until after the war. Private Bealer was received into the Army at New Cumberland and received his training at Fort George G. Meade, Md. He embarked for overseas last Fall. He served for a time in England and was then transferred to Algiers.
