John Gaydos, Wife Have Three Sons Serving Country

Three brothers, sons of Mr. and Mrs. John A. Gaydos, 621 Hillside Avenue, is the family's contribution to the determination of the United States to wipe out Hitler, Tojo and Mussolini and all they advocate.

The young men are William, John and Richard, the former two in the Army; the latter in the Air Corps.

William wears the chevrons of a corporal. He was inducted into the armed forces on October 17, 1941, and received his basic training at Fort Eustis. He was subsequently sent to a camp in New York and later to Camp Kilmer, N. J. About one year after his induction he was sent overseas, assigned to an anti-aircraft unit of the Coast Artillery. He is a graduate of Bethlehem Technical High School.

John is a private first class, in Company A, Twelfth Infantry. He enlisted on October 20, 1941, and for some time had been stationed at Camp Wheeler and Camp Gordon, Ga., and more recently at Fort Dix. He also graduated from Bethlehem Technical High School. He observed his twenty-third birthday anniversary Sunday, July 18.

Private Richard, U. S. Air Corps, enlisted on December 15, 1942, and following a basic training at Miami, Fla., was sent to West Overfield, Chickapee, Mass. He graduated from Bethlehem Technical High School with the Class of '41. Before his induction he was an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company. On Monday his parents received a cablegram from him, conveying his
