Lt. Col. Miller, Surgeon, Opens Office in Allentown

Lt. Col. Harry Miller, M. D., former Detroit surgeon has been discharged from the Army Medical Corps and today is resuming practice in Allentown. Colonel Miller was discharged on Feb. 4 after 41 months of service.

While stationed in the United States, Dr. Miller served on the surgical and orthopedic services of hospitals at Ft. Hayes, Columbus, Ohio; Camp Breckenridge, Ky., and Ft. Reilly, Kansas. He was sent to North Africa in August, 1943, and saw service at Oran, Algeria, and in the South France and Rhineland campaigns with the University of Oregon unit, 46th General Hospital, in the capacity of chief of general surgery and chief of chest surgery sections.

Dr. Miller is the son of Mr. and Mrs. David Miller, this city. He attended Liberty High School and Lehigh University. In 1935 he was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania College of Medicine and served a two-year internship at the Philadelphia General Hospital. In 1941 he completed his surgical training at the Detroit

Receiving Hospital and also received a master's degree in surgery. He was then appointed chief surgeon for the Chrysler Corporation in Detroit, a post he held until entering the service.

In 1942 Dr. Miller was admitted to Fellowship in the American College of Surgeons and also successfully completed the examinations for specialization in surgery, being admitted to the American Board of Surgery. He is a member of the Detroit Academy of Surgery and of the staffs of St. Luke's Hospital in Bethlehem, and the Sacred Heart and Allentown Hospitals in that city.

Dr. Miller has opened offices at 1119 Hamilton St. He will limit his practice to general surgery.
