**LIKES MID-WEST FOLKS**

**Local Soldier Says Hospitality Ex-  
ceeds That of South.**

The hospitality of mid-Western folk is far superior to famous Southern hospitality, one judges from a letter just received from Paul Frey, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Frey, 729 Main Street, who has just been transferred from Keesler Field, Mississippi, to an unnamed field near Madison, Wisconsin.

Private Frey, in his letter to his parents, writes at length in praise of the treatment he and his fellow soldiers have received from the folks of Madison. The Bethlehem soldier is a radio operator with the United States Army Air Force. He was at Keesler Field until two weeks ago where he had been sent from Fort George G. Meade, Md., following his enlistment.

Prior to enlisting with Bruce Miller, also of this city, Private Frey was a mechanic in the 48-inch mill of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
