Lt. Comdr. Kelley Enjoys West Coast Vacation

In October 1941, Comdr. Kelley was on the Army Reserve list, having served several months as a private at Fort Sill, Okla. At the declaration of war, he applied for duty in the Navy and was commissioned a lieutenant (j.g.). He trained at Notre Dame University and was stationed at the U. S. Naval Proving Grounds, Dalgrem, Va., until his release from Naval duty. He was graduated from Lehigh University in 1933.
