### Brothers Observe Anniversaries In Armed Service

Frank observed his birthday anniversary on April 6, somewhere in the South Pacific, where he is serving since December of 1942. He was inducted into the service in September, 1941, at New Cumberland and received his basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., and served in the Panama Canal Zone for one year before being transferred to the South Pacific and has been there since.

Sigmund will observe his birthday anniversary on Easter Sunday somewhere in Italy. Sigmund was inducted into service in September, 1940, with the former National Guards, Battery C, 213th Coast Artillery (AA) and was stationed at various camps in the States before being sent overseas in November 1942 with his unit to North Africa. He took part in various campaigns including the Tunisian campaign where he was wounded in action. Last April 1 he was awarded the Purple Heart. After he recovered he was sent with his unit to Italy in September 1943 where he is stationed since.

Frank and Sigmund have a brother-in-law, Lieut. Francis M. Kerecz, in service, and stationed at San Francisco, Cal. Lieut. and Mrs. Kerecz, the former Irene C. Krucli, left to return to their home in California on Monday after spending a leave with their parents here. While home on leave, Lieut. Kerecz was confirmation sponsor for Edward F. Krucli.
