### **Lt. Stephen Kuti Honorably Discharged**

Having served in the European Theatre and Japan as a platoon leader and radio operator, 1st Lt. Stephen Kuti returned to his home February 7 and was discharged from the Army at the Indiantown Gap Military Reservation February 14.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. John W. Kuti, 308 East Broad St., he enlisted as a 2nd Lieutenant March 30, 1942. He received chemical warfare training at Fort Monmouth, N. J. and several other training camps in the States before going to the European Theatre, where he served 6 months with the Signal Battalion. He was later assigned to Japan where he served with the 16th Operational Battalion prior to returning to the States for his discharge.

A former Bethlehem Steel Company employee, Kuti intends to further his education at Lehigh University. His wife, the former Helen Udvardi, and their 4-year-old daughter, Patricia, reside at the Broad St. address. Lt. Kuti's brothers, Sgt. William, who served with the Army Air Forces and Pfc. John R., with the Field Artillery, were both recently discharged.
