**Pfc. Henry Schantz
Enjoys Rest Furlough
At Nice, France**

Pfc. Henry L. Schantz, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ellis G. Schantz, 232 East Union Boulevard, recently spent a seven-day rest furlough in the U. S. Riviera Recreational Area at Nice, France.

Guest of the Army, he and other GI's lived in requisitioned hotels, ate American food prepared by French chefs and received the service accorded the Riviera's pre-war clientele. Almost no military restrictions existed, with large posters everywhere proclaiming "No Saluting Required."

Pfc. Schantz has been overseas for 11 months and wears the ETO ribbon with three battle stars, earned in Belgium, Germany and Luxembourg; the Combat Infantry badge and Good Conduct medal. He is a former employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
