

Uhl, Frederick E.

Former Allentonian Heads Service Command

Major General Frederick E. Uhl, who left Allentown nearly 40 years ago to carve for himself a distinguished niche in the service of his country, has been assigned to head the Fourth Service Command with headquarters in Atlanta, Ga.

According to an announcement by the War Department he is being transferred to Atlanta from Omaha, Neb., where he commanded the Seventh Service Command.

A former resident of Allentown and a graduate of Allentown High School with the class of 1902, General Uhl has been in military service on active duty since he was appointed to the United States Military Academy at West Point in 1906 by the late Congressman Marcus C. L. Kline. He was graduated from West Point in 1910.

During World War I he was a general staff officer of the AEF in France and was cited by General Pershing for "exceptionally meritorious and conspicuous service."

Major Uhl is married to the former Julia Lathrop Ramsay and is a brother of Mrs. G. Donald Marks of Emmaus.
